## Telecinco Cinema films "Regression" & "Capture the Flag" sweep the board with half of the weekend box office

- The premiere of "Regression" has become the most watched film release with more than 356,000 spectators
- In its sixth week in cinemas "Capture the Flag" has excellently maintained its position making it the third most watched film of the weekend accumulating more than 1.5 million viewers

The film subsidiary of Mediaset España, **Telecinco Cinema** has managed to grab almost **50% of the box office** registered from Friday to Sunday with the two films currently in cinemas **"Regression"** and **"Capture the Flag"**, both in the Top 3 takings ranking.

The launch of **"Regression"** a psychological thriller directed by **Alejandro Amenabar** and starring Ethan Hawke and Emma Watson reached cinemas on Friday, and has been seen by over **356,000 spectators** (according to provisional data from Rentrak), ranking as the **most watched Spanish film release of the year** and is experiencing a great reception from the audience after opening in September at the 63<sup>rd</sup> San Sebastián International Film Festival.

Meanwhile **"Capture the Flag"**, the animated film directed by **Enrique Gato**, in its sixth week in theaters was the third most watched film of the weekend showing an excellent level of maintenance with almost 92,000 new viewers. The film, which since its debut has remained among the four most watched films leading the box office in its first two weekends, it has currently **accumulated more than 1.5 million viewers**.

It has already become the best Spanish animated film of the year and after being the first national film which is based at NASA, "Capture the Flag" will be seen in over 25 countries following an agreement with Paramount Pictures International. Among others, the film will be seen soon in the UK, Germany, Mexico, Brazil, Russia, Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Panama, Peru, Venezuela, Trinidad, Poland, the Netherlands, Israel, Ukraine, Egypt, UAE, Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, Kuwait, Lebanon, Iraq and Jordan.
